
Malin Grundberg, Museum Director of The Royal Armoury, welcomes all participants to the 39th IATM Conference.


Super Mario and Mega Man welcomes us to the National Museum of Science and Technology. A new day at the 39th IATM Conference. Let's go!




Tobias Lumb from National National Railway Museum talks about the Mallard 75 anniversary and how it became a huge success - inspiring!
