

Open to discoverers

More than 50 years the Swiss Museum of Transport in Lucerne has established a reputation as an innovative and creative museum that never fails to amaze its visitors. It is an exciting window to the world of transport, and mobility. The Swiss Museum of Transport presents its content in four languages in a hands-on, stimulating and playful manner and offers visitors an educationally and intellectually rewarding experience. It is a place where people meet and interact, a place of education, research and entertainment. It aims to raise people's interest in the transport and communication-related aspects of our lives.

Thanks to its exhibitions and activities, the museum is consistently able to build bridges between the past, the present and the future. It is widely appreciated as a destination for all generations, as an inspirational and enjoyable experience for young and old, for families and for school classes.

The focus of the latest exhibition is on the new Gotthard Base Tunnel, which has been inaugurated on the 1st of June 2016. Visitors are able to get a real feel for the world's longest railway tunnel (57 km) – the civil engineering exploit of the century.







Road Transport Hall refreshed

The exhibitions housed on three floors in the Swiss Museum's Road Transport Hall have been comprehensively refreshed. Great importance has been attached to the quality of the visitor experience and the degree of interactivity. A new mezzanine houses an extensive display of two- and three-wheeled vehicles. Marking the 200th anniversary of the bicycle, which is being celebrated in 2017, special designs provide an additional highpoint in the history of the bicycle, including that of the electric bicycle. Monteverdi cars belong to Switzerland's industrial cultural heritage, being of national and international importance. The worldwide reputation of the marque was based on the variety of high-quality vehicles built by Peter Monteverdi. 13 Monteverdi vehicles are on permanent exhibition exclusively on the first floor. SEE YOU, the mirror world presented by the Swiss Council for Accident Prevention (bfu), is designed to draw in the crowds on the ground floor.







Space Travel at its best

The Space Travel exhibition at the Swiss Museum of Transport boasts a fresh new look. The area devoted to space travel in the Aviation Hall has been significantly extended. Visitors are immersed in the past, present and immediate future of space flight. Particular attention has been paid to the achievements of Switzerland's aerospace industry. The main attraction of the exhibition is the interactive «Space Transformer», a walk-in cube that rotates about its diagonal axis. Inside it, visitors are confronted with a ceiling that becomes a wall and a wall that turns into a floor. Like in a space station, the concepts of up and down are relative.

The Aviation and Space Travel Hall first opened back in 1972. It was a momentous moment for the museum's then director, Alfred Waldis. He had committed himself to exhibiting the topic of space travel and was on excellent terms with US astronauts and Soviet cosmonauts.







Museum of Communication

The Museum of Communication in Berne is the only such institution in Switzerland to be devoted entirely to interpersonal understanding. With its new core exhibition launching in the late summer 2017 supplemented by annual temporary exhibitions, the museum offers its audiences a wealth of interactive activities surrounding the theme of communication. Wide-screen video projections, interactive games and plenty of information provide visitors with an engaging and fascinating environment. The museum is multilingual throughout. Its focus is on the people using the technology, not the technology itself, as a result of which the visitor is in for a few surprises.

The museum where people are encouraged to interact with the exhibits and that tells exciting stories is proving popular: its exhibitions attract around 80,000 visits a year.
