49th IATM Conference | 13-15 September 2026 | Belfast, Northern Ireland

This year, **IATM will meet in Belfast**, the capital city of Northern Ireland. For decades of the 20th century Belfast was synonymous with the civil and political conflict known as 'The Troubles'. Since the [Belfast/Good Friday Agreement](#) brought an end to the conflict in 1998, the city has made **remarkable use of its maritime and industrial heritage to change the stories it tells about its own history, and to power impressive cultural and economic change in the region.**

Drawing on this example, **we want to discuss our roles within the neighbourhoods, communities, cities or regions that surround us.** We want to look at institutions as **part of the social fabric** as well as drivers and enablers of change. As always, this IATM Conference aims to **inspire your work** and to offer the chance for **exchange and support**. We will look at the role of our museums in their neighbourhoods, region or city. Through stories and talks about different concepts and approaches towards **placemaking**, we aim to inspire your work and the communities or local businesses you interact with.
